

LEPC Tabletop Exercise

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Purpose

- The purpose of this exercise is to provide participants an opportunity to evaluate current response concepts, plans, and capabilities for an LEPC and the process developing ESF 10 which covers Hazardous Materials Response. The exercise will focus on the role the local emergency planning commission plays in developing and maintaining County emergency plans in conjunction with the local Emergency Manager.

Scope

- This is a tabletop exercise which emphasizes the role of the local emergency planning commission in development of ESF 10 as well as other supporting ESFs and base plan

Core Capabilities

- Planning
- Environmental Response Health and Safety

Objectives

- Review the role of the LEPC in development of the County EOP, specifically ESF 10
- Assist the County Emergency Manager in working with the LEPC.
- Review the planning process and addressing community specific hazards and special facility hazards
- Review the process for a commodity flow study
