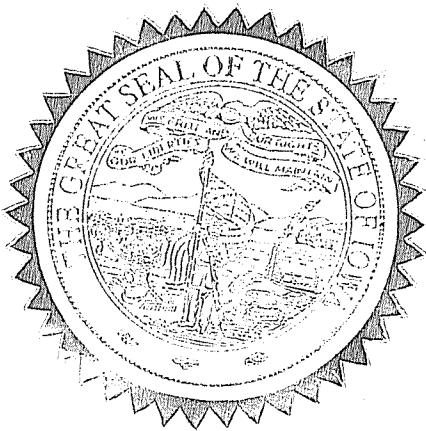


PROCLAMATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY

- WHEREAS,** On Wednesday, May 25, 2011 releases from reservoirs on the upper Missouri River were increased due to above normal snow in the mountains and extraordinary rain that occurred throughout the upper Missouri River basin; and
- WHEREAS,** historic flooding is forecast that will cause significant economic impacts as well as damage to critical infrastructure and residential property; and
- WHEREAS,** predictions from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers indicate that major flooding is imminent, and
- WHEREAS,** surveys and reports forwarded by local officials in Fremont, Harrison, Mills, Monona, Pottawattamie and Woodbury counties indicate that state assistance will be needed to respond to and recover from the effects of this flood.


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Terry E. Branstad, Governor of the State of Iowa, do hereby proclaim a state of disaster emergency for Fremont, Harrison, Mills, Monona, Pottawattamie and Woodbury counties in the State of Iowa, for the aforementioned reasons. This proclamation of disaster emergency authorizes state governments to render goods and sufficient aid to assist those areas in this time of need.
